The Etobicoke Camera Club introduced me to the Art in photography. No longer satisfied with just memory photographs, the club helps me strive for photographs that others will also enjoy.







Harry Martin Presented

"Eagle Island"

on Monday, March 17, 2025



This presentation delved into Harry's obsession with the icon of Scotland's wilderness - the golden eagle. Rare, elusive and prone to living in hard to reach places all adds to the allure of such a species. The Isle of Skye is home to a healthy population of these raptors and since moving to the island 10 years ago Harry has spent hundreds, if not thousands, of hours documenting their lives and behaviour. During the presentation he shared his insights, tips and stories on a decade spent photographing eagle island.

Harry is a professional wildlife and landscape photographer based on the stunning Isle of Skye in Scotland. He trained as a zoologist but veered into the guiding industry to share his passion for the natural world. He has worked from the Canadian Rockies to the heart of China and many places in between, delivering high quality photographic and wildlife experiences. He now works on the Isle of Skye as part of an award winning team of photographers as part of the Skye Photo Academy, and the Photography Online team.




