

Generally some of the mono prints suffered from lack of contrast - being too flat. Think of simplicity of elements - some prints included too many elements. Be aware of colour of matts/mounting as to coordination with the subject colours in the print.

Etobicoke Camera Club Minutes of the General Business Meeting April 20th 2009

ECC Constitution

President Kas Stone outlined the Board's proposed change to the constitution that would increase the number of competition divisions from 2 to 3, with the addition of an "Advanced" division between Intermediate and Superset. This would result in the following changes to wording in the constitution (indicated in red):

Section 9. INTRA-CLUB COMPETITIONS

For the purposes of competitions, the Club shall have the following three levels of competence:

- 1. Intermediate
- 2. Advanced
- 3. Superset

Rationale: Due to the influx of new members to the ECC and the increasing number of people participating in club competitions, two problems have arisen: (1) competition evenings have become administratively challenging for our Image Evaluation team, and (2) the Intermediate division has become so large that some of our less photographically-experienced members are disadvantaged in competition, and it has become extremely difficult for any Intermediate division member to score enough points during the regular competition season to advance to the Superset division. An "Advanced" division between Intermediate and Superset that would allow more experienced Intermediate members to move forward and enable less experienced members to compete on more equal footing.

Note: Details of a fair system for assigning members to the three divisions will be worked out by the Image Evaluation team and presented to the Board for approval at its meeting on May 13th, 2009. The Rules of Competition will be revised accordingly and members will be notified of the changes well in advance of the 2009-2010 competition season.

Kas asked for a show of hands in favour of the proposed change:

In favour = ALL Opposed = NONE Vote = CARRIED

Year-End Message from the President, May 2009



This edition of the *Viewfinder* brings us to the conclusion of another successful season at the Etobicoke Camera Club. One of our most remarkable achievements this year was the club's continued, strong increase in membership, the total now standing at about

140, of which 46 are new members. Many of these new people have jumped aboard with an enthusiasm never seen before. They have submitted images for competitions, attended outings, participated in the club's new mentoring program, joined the NIKSIG and CANSIG special interest groups, entered shows in the Member Photo Essay evening, contributed images to our Canadian Geographic Photo Club submission, attended the year-end banquet, and even taken positions on the Board of Directors. This has made the ECC an exciting and dynamic group, and one that will adapt well to the changing environment as digital photography replaces film next year.

However it has also presented us with some challenges! Weekly meetings have sometimes exceeded the time officially available. The enormous number of competition entries has frequently swamped the administrative system. The wide range of photographic experience and interests has put conflicting demands on our programming. And the banquet venue was stuffed (quite literally!) to capacity with almost 90 members and guests.

Rising to the challenge, the Board of Directors has instituted several important changes that it hopes will ease the administrative pressure and increase the quality of our club experience next year. You can look forward to:

- 1) **Better Equipment:** a new, higher-resolution digital projector in place at the start of the season, and a new projection laptop, with the old laptop replacing the failing scoring laptop that has caused so many technical difficulties in recent competitions.
- 2) **Fairer Competitions**: a new "Advanced" division between Intermediate and Superset that will allow members to compete on more even footing with people of similar ability and experience.
- A New "Creative" Competition: taking advantage of the club's move to digital-only competitions, the Creative competition will encourage photographic experimentation, both

in camera and with post-capture image processing software. It will replace the Scenics competition that has become increasingly difficult to administer with so many out-of-category images. Scenics (with or without any "hand-of-man" features) may now be entered in one of the two Photographer's Choice competitions instead. The schedule will be adjusted so that the Creative competition will be held later in the season, giving members the opportunity to learn new techniques before having to submit their images.

- 4) **Maintain Quality Programming**: next year's schedule will include a healthy balance of entertainment and education (weighted slightly in favour of education), with an interesting lineup of presentations and seminars already booked.
- 5) **Better Time Management**: in addition to various time-easing changes to competitions, the enforcement of a strict 20-minute time limit for Member Shows to enhance participants' learning experience and to allow sufficient time for the image critique portion of these evenings.
- 6) **Continuation of the mentoring program**: the format to be adjusted slightly in response to comments from this year's participants, likely with a "bank" of members having expertise in particular subject areas available to assist newer members with questions in those areas.

I will be in touch by email during the summer to bring you updates as they arise. Meanwhile, I'd like to wish you all a very happy summer and many exciting adventures with your cameras, and I look forward to seeing you again at the start of the next season on Monday September 14th.
