MEMBERS SHOW A Dog Walker's Weekend By Elaine Freedman



"Elaine's show was a great human interest story full of beautiful images of dogs and nature, including some stunning sunsets. Of course, where there are dogs, there are people. What I really liked about the people shots was the very human aspect they portrayed. These were not posed shots but just regular people interacting with

nature and their dogs. You could see the very close bonds between the owners and their dogs. The story unfolded from the long drive up north, to casual strolls through the country, to playing in the water together, to sleeping on the couch together, exhausted after a busy day.

The story started with a map which set the time and place (northern Ontario). Many in the club probably have not seen that part of our beautiful province of Ontario . The story had a definite flow from the packing of vehicle for the long journey, to the beautiful scenery along the way (including some wonderful waterfalls), to fun times together during the weekend, and ending with memories of some of the dogs who have since passed on. For some this last part was very moving, but for others it seemed that they were not as comfortable with this aspect of the show.

Elaine used an eclectic mix of music some of which seemed perfect for the particular segment of the story and some of which perhaps had more significance to the people who participated in these dog walker's weekends. Similarly, the show had great appeal to those in the audience who love dogs and may have even had similar weekends themselves, and most certainly would appeal to those who actually attended the dog walker's weekends in the show, but perhaps was too long for the rest of the audience. Experience in the club over the years is that members prefer several shorter shows rather than one big long one. Even if the shorter shows follow the same story as in this case, it seems to make the experience more enjoyable.

All in all, this was a wonderful human (and dog) interest story, filled with great photography, eclectic music, and lots of humour. The images generally were very sharp and well taken." "Thanks Elaine for a great evening. I'm sure it took a lot of work to put this show together but it was obviously done with a love and passion for dogs and with a nice touch of humour."

The Four Nations Competition is a friendly photographic competition between South Africa, Australia, New Zealand and Canada. One hundred entries from each country are submitted for judging with the total score from all one hundred counted. The competition started in 2007 with South Africa and Australia. New Zealand was invited but did not participate in 2007 and 2008. All four competed in 2009 with South Africa winning the aggregate score. CAPA is the official entry body for Canada , choosing the 100 Canadian entries from 100 different photographers.


Our club did very well, coming in 7 out of 25.
