September and October meetings:

What a great start to our 2010/2011 season! Our first presenter was Richard Martin who had a huge turnout on September 13^{th,} for his presentation on "The Photographers Eye". This presentation illustrated the way that his work combines an architectural love of geometry, pattern and texture with a painter's sensitivity to colour, light and composition. It included great visuals illustrating some of his more unorthodox concepts. Many of his ideas pushed us well outside of our usual comfort zone.

The September 24th, the evening was devoted to introducing new members to some of the aspects of club membership. Andy Heics talked about the ECC membership in CAPA (Canadian Association for Photographic Art) and Mike Marshall talked about the club's membership in GTCCC (Greater Toronto Council of Camera Clubs). As competition and their judging are a significant part of club activity, Judy Griffin gave a comprehensive presentation on the criteria that is used to rate an image. This presentation is included in the club website and is useful reading for any member less experienced in the art of photography whether they wish to compete or not. Lastly, Diane Sawatzky explained the methodology that must be followed to enter an image into competition.

The following Monday saw a presentation by Andrew Patrick from the Epson Company. As a professional in the field of printing and the use of Epson printers, he was able to give considerable insight into the management of such aspects as colour space and various colour profiles. It was excellent for those who are already printers and was a reinforcement of what printing parameters to use. For those who plan to print, Andrew provided the necessary details. Now it is up to the newer printers to explore the necessary printing parameters that they need to get the prints that complement their images. Some of the terminology may have been difficult for newcomers and consideration may have to be

given to including a more basic printing presentation in the future.

October started with Christopher Siou talking about "The Arts and Crafts of Nature Photography". He describes himself as an outdoor photographer and has won local and international awards. He gave a very clear overview of the camera and its features as well as the accessories such as macro & telephoto lenses, and tripods. He recommends truth to nature, with subtle HDR effects to maintain realism. Looking specifically at photos, he gave many insights into producing effective nature images. This presentation provided much assistance to those interested in producing visually pleasing, spatially interesting & balanced photographs. On the following Saturday (October 9th), there was a trip to the Butterfly Conservatory in Cambridge. Photos from this excursion are included at the end of this newsletter. Club Outings are a great way for members to share their experience and for new members to get their hands on tips in the field.

The last two weeks in October, were devoted to Competitions, first Photographers Choice 1 and then Prints 1.

The Membership cards were distributed to those present at the October 26th meeting. If you were absent you can get yours from Evelyn Sanders, Chair of the Membership Committee, the next time you attend a meeting.

November meetings:

November 1st

This meeting included for the first time, a short commentary by the winners in each of the Intermediate and Superset competition levels. It is hoped that these commentaries will assist the members to understand the techniques used to compose, capture and process a winning image.

This was followed by the image critique on potential submissions to the Nature Competition. These critiques are a worthwhile forum for

evaluation of an image in a friendly and not competitive environment.

Lastly there was a slide show by Don Poulton on the "Wild Flowers of Texas"

A seminar will be given by Michael O'Brien on - Photographing People -. He is a Toronto based photographer, who works on portrait commissions and event photography both locally and abroad. His client list includes Lululemon Athletica, Maandigeh Circle, United Way Canada, and The Institute of Traditional Medicine. Michael is known primarily for the intuitive, natural way that he photographs people and places. His formal portraits, as well as his travel and documentary images of people are all built on a foundation of trust and respect.
