# From the President

I hope this very warm summer has been enjoyable and you have had many wonderful opportunities to take photos both at home and in your travels.

Our first meeting on September 12th will kick off our club's 59th year since our founding in 1957. The 2016-2017 program will undoubtedly be both entertaining and educational as always.

Professional Photographer and Tour Organizer, Juris Kornets, heads up our fall season with a presentation on the Art of Street Photography. I joined Juris on his excellent Cuba tour last spring and he coached us in the challenging and rewarding skills required in capturing people "in the moment". Several other great presenters will come out through the year to entertain us and expand our photo skills, including presentations on Macro, Urban, Architectural, Nature and Landscape photography and also on how to create dramatic Black and White images.

For this year, our eight competitions will remain as is, except that the People competition will be replaced with Landscape. The Photographers Choice #2 will again be in Monochrome, which places emphasis on light, form, texture and tonal range. Count on the Creative competition to push the limits and show just what can be done both with in-camera and Photoshop skills working at their best. The Nature photos always amaze me as I know the patience and dedication that is required to "nail" that shot. Architecture is everywhere, so subject matter is easy to find, but it is often difficult to make it exciting!

Once again, the Print category will continue with two competitions. As a special perk for our past award winners, our club has been selected by the Neilson Park Creative Centre in Etobicoke to hold an exclusive ECC Photographic Exhibition from October 3-23 with about 35 – 40 prints. Stay tuned for more details from our esteemed Past President Bruce Barton who will organize this event. Outings are an important part of our club activities, allowing us get together in a friendly semi-social manner while lending a helping hand to beginners, newcomers and advanced participants alike. Through outings, we discover new venues, find terrific subject matter for competitions and learn how to "find those elusive winning images" that are so easy to just walk past and are often right under our noses!

Our Outings team has been lining up another great year of field trips that include High Park, the Bygone Days Heritage Village in Collingwood, the Rockwood Conservation Park, Toronto's Graffiti Lane and more. 

## In Memoriam



We are very saddened to report the passing of Des Hollingbery, a former member, on July 25th, 2016 after a lengthy illness.

Des joined Etobicoke Camera Club in the 1968, and was an active member for many years. His dedication and work over the years in various capacities on the Board have been valuable to the growth and dynamics of the Club. Des was chair of Image Evaluation in 1974-75. He worked with Maggie Sale on Image Evaluation in 1996-98 and with Judy Griffin in 1998-2000. Des chaired Social in 1991-92, and looked after the ECC library in 1995-96.

Des initiated the Honour Role Project in May 1992 to preserve a record of the members who worked on the Board through the many years of the Club.

Des was a Superset Photographer, presenting numerous A/V shows through the years, and winning many ribbons with his lovely images. He had a great eye capturing the quiet beauty of nature. He won an engraved silver tray from Molson's for the top Canadian Landscape in 1978 at the Club.

After retiring from the Club in the 2012-13 season, he was a member of The Old Boys' Club with other former ECC members, Mark Bargent, Doug Powell, and Bill Harrison. In November 2013, they came out to the Club and entertained members with some of their A/V shows. We were treated to a variety of themes; a walk down memory lane as we experienced memories of their time in the Club, sharing some of the past, and their love of photography.

Des' easy-going manner, and his willingness to help, made him well-respected and liked by all.

Our condolences go to his daughter, Sandra, and her family at this time.
